If you entered the media center during February you would have heard jazz music in honor of Black History Month. The online jazz radio station that we used is located at www accuradio.com. Jazz music featuring piano, saxophone, or guitar was shared each school day in the media center as a celebration of this innovation. Their goal in February was to read about the lives of significant blacks and their goal in March is to read about significant females in honor of Women's History Month.
